Kolbe was killed with an injection of phenol. The sergeant survived to tell the story. Monica who lived in North Africa. a centre of Christianity, in 4th Century, constantly prayed for her brilliant but wayward son. Eventually he turned his

back on philosophy and heresy to become one of the most influential Christian figures in 2000 years. He wrote "Lord, you have made us for yourself, and our

hearts are restless until they rest in you".

There are many more saints and faithful people remembered in the month of August. Why remember? Because their love, devotion and courage reflected in human lives something of God. Archbishop Michael Ramsey said that "Saints are not made by doing good, rather they have a strange nearness to God which makes God real and near to other people". Another way of putting it is that they are Christ-like. They encourage and inspire us to grow in faith, hope and love.
